QUESTION 1

Under BHGS rules, when a mover's charges are based on weight and distance, the distance used to compute the transportation charge must be measured between which two points?

ANSWER B

WHY BHGS rules specify that distance, when used as a factor in computing charges, is measured between the point of origin and the point of destination. Options A, C, and D describe distances that have no regulatory basis for the tariff.

Which of the following items is required by BHGS regulations to appear on the bill of lading issued to a shipper?

- ☐ A The mover's projected profit margin on the move
- ☒ B The agreed-upon date or time period for delivery of the shipment

ANSWER B

WHY The bill of lading must contain the agreed-upon date or period of time for delivery. Movers are not required to disclose profit margins, shipper income, or internal staffing assignments on the bill of lading.

QUESTION 3

SINGLE CHOICE

A mover prepares a written non-binding estimate for a shipper. The actual shipment weight is 1,500 pounds more than estimated. Under BHGS rules, what is the mover's obligation regarding the additional weight?

- ☐ A The mover may collect the full difference at any time, without notice
- ☒ B The mover may collect no more than 110 percent of the estimated total charges at delivery, and the balance must be deferred for invoicing within a regulatory time limit

ANSWER B

WHY For a non-binding estimate, the mover may not demand more than 110 percent of the estimated total at delivery. Any amount over 110 percent must be deferred and billed to the shipper, and may not be collected at delivery.

Under the Household Movers Act, the mover's basic level of liability for household goods is commonly referred to as:

ANSWER B

WHY California law provides for a basic (released-value) level of liability at 60 cents per pound per article unless the shipper elects, and pays for, full-value protection. Option A is wrong because full value is not free; Option C misstates the default; Option D is not how the statutory scheme works.

Under BHGS rules, a shipper must file a written claim for loss or damage to household goods with the carrier within how many days after delivery?

ANSWER C

WHY A written claim for loss, damage, or injury must be filed with the carrier within 90 days after delivery under BHGS regulations. The 30-day and 60-day options are too short; one year is too long for this initial filing requirement.

Before a household goods carrier may operate in California, which of the following is required?

ANSWER A

WHY Household goods carriers must obtain a permit from the BHGS to operate in California. The FAA does not regulate surface movers; city charters and franchise agreements do not replace the state permit requirement.

When a shipment is transported on a weight-and-distance basis, which document must the mover provide to the shipper showing the weight of the shipment?

ANSWER A

WHY On a weight-and-distance shipment, the mover must obtain a certified weight certificate from a licensed weighmaster and provide the weight information to the shipper. Driver letters, home scales, and fuel invoices do not satisfy this requirement.

Which of the following are prohibited advertising or sales practices under BHGS rules for household goods carriers? (Choose two.)

ANSWER A - B

WHY Advertising a guaranteed price without complying with binding-estimate requirements is prohibited, and demanding an advance deposit exceeding regulatory limits is prohibited. Providing a written itemized estimate and providing the bill of lading are required, not prohibited.

Which of the following items must appear on a written estimate issued by a household goods carrier? (Choose two.)

ANSWER **A** • **B**

WHY A written estimate must identify the carrier (including name, address, and permit number) and contain an itemized breakdown, or the rate basis on which charges will be computed. Annual revenue projections and individual employee rosters are not required estimate contents.
