QUESTION 1

MULTIPLE CHOICE

Under the California Business and Professions Code, which of the following requirements must be met before a licensed embalmer may embalm a human remains? (Choose two.)

- ☒ **A** The embalmer must hold a valid and current California embalmer license issued by the Cemetery and Funeral Bureau.
- ☒ **B** The next of kin or person with the right to control disposition must provide written authorization for embalming.

ANSWER A - B

WHY Correct: A and B. Under the Business and Professions Code, a person must hold a valid embalmer license issued by the Bureau to perform embalming in California, and embalming may not lawfully be performed absent authorization from the person with the right to control disposition of the remains. C is incorrect because the embalmer is not required by statute to conduct any religious ceremony. D is incorrect because death registration is the responsibility of the funeral director and local registrar, not a prerequisite the embalmer personally fulfills before each embalming.

QUESTION 2

MULTIPLE CHOICE

Which of the following are requirements established by the California Health and Safety Code regarding the handling of human remains? (Choose two.)

- ☒ **A** A death must be reported to the local registrar before a burial permit can be issued.

ANSWER A - C

WHY Correct: A and C. The Health and Safety Code requires that deaths be registered with the local registrar before permits authorizing disposition can be issued, and it mandates timely refrigeration or preservation of remains when disposition is delayed. B is incorrect because the Code does not mandate a sealed casket during every transport on public highways. D is incorrect because there is no statutory requirement that the embalmer personally attend every interment.

Which California state agency is responsible for licensing and regulating embalmers?

ANSWER A

WHY Correct: A. The Cemetery and Funeral Bureau, within the Department of Consumer Affairs, is the California agency that licenses and regulates embalmers. B is incorrect because the Department of Public Health handles vital records but does not license embalmers. C is incorrect because the Medical Board regulates physicians, not embalmers. D is incorrect because there is no separate Board of Funeral Directors and Embalmers; that function resides in the Bureau.

QUESTION 4

SINGLE CHOICE

Under the Business and Professions Code, which of the following is a permissible basis for disciplinary action against an embalmer licensed in California?

- ☐ A The embalmer performs competent work but charges a fee lower than competitors in the area.

A is incorrect because fee competition is not grounds for discipline. C is incorrect because an embalmer is not required to practice a particular subspecialty. D is incorrect because declining a case for a legitimate scheduling reason is not misconduct.

QUESTION 5

Under California law, who generally has the primary right to control the disposition of a deceased person's remains?

C is incorrect because the personal representative of the estate is lower in priority than certain surviving relatives. D is incorrect because the certifying physician has no role in disposition decisions.

Which statement accurately reflects California law regarding the identification and confidentiality of human remains entrusted to an embalmer?
