ANSWER B

WHY Cultural relativism is the principle that an individual's beliefs and practices should be understood on their own terms, rather than judged by the standards of another culture. Ethnocentrism is the opposite — evaluating other cultures by one's own standards. Cultural diffusion refers to the spread of cultural traits, and cultural materialism is a framework that explains cultural features in terms of material conditions.

ANSWER D

WHY Physical, or biological, anthropology focuses on human biology, evolution, fossil records, and primatology. Cultural anthropology studies living cultures; linguistic anthropology focuses on language; archaeology studies past human activity through material remains.

A relative dating technique used in archaeology that compares the fluorine, uranium, or nitrogen content of bones buried in the same soil to determine whether they are of the same age is called:

ANSWER D

WHY Fluorine analysis is a relative dating method in which bones absorb fluorine and other elements from groundwater over time; bones buried in the same deposits for comparable periods will show similar fluorine levels. Radiocarbon and potassium-argon dating are absolute (chronometric) methods, and thermoluminescence is used on fired materials such as pottery.

Which of the following are examples of descent systems documented in the ethnographic record? (Choose two.)

ANSWER A - C

WHY Patrilineal and matrilineal descent are the two most common unilineal descent systems, tracing group membership through the father's line or the mother's line, respectively. Endogamy and exogamy are marriage rules (mating within or outside a given group), not descent systems.

ANSWER B

WHY Saussure distinguished *langue* (the abstract system of linguistic rules shared by speakers of a community) from *parole* (the actual utterances produced by individual speakers). This distinction underpins much modern linguistic anthropology.

ANSWER C

WHY Natural selection is the process by which individuals with heritable traits better suited to their environment leave more offspring, so those traits increase in frequency over generations. Genetic drift is random change in allele frequencies, mutation is a source of new variation, and gene flow is movement of alleles between populations.

ANSWER B

WHY Generalized reciprocity involves giving without an immediate or specific expectation of return, typical among close kin and friends. Balanced reciprocity expects a roughly equal return within a defined period. Market exchange involves impersonal transactions at agreed prices; redistribution involves a central authority collecting and reallocating goods.

ANSWER C

WHY Open stratification (or open-class system) permits significant social mobility based on achieved status such as education and occupation. Closed stratification, such as caste, fixes an individual's position largely by ascribed status at birth.

ANSWER A • B

WHY Franz Boas is associated with historical particularism and is credited with establishing the four-field approach in U.S. anthropology. Bronislaw Malinowski developed structural functionalism through his fieldwork in the Trobriand Islands. Lewis Henry Morgan is associated with unilineal cultural evolution (not cultural ecology), and Julian Steward developed cultural ecology (not unilineal evolution).
