QUESTION 1

SINGLE CHOICE

Under Massachusetts law, a podiatrist must hold a license issued by the Massachusetts Board of Registration in Podiatry. Which of the following best describes the Board's primary role?

- ☐ A Adjudicating malpractice claims against licensed podiatrists.
- ☒ B Issuing licenses and regulating the practice of podiatry in the Commonwealth.

ANSWER B

WHY The Massachusetts Board of Registration in Podiatry is responsible for licensing and regulating podiatrists in the Commonwealth. It does not adjudicate malpractice (that is the courts), nor does it set Medicare rates or accredit schools.

QUESTION 2

SINGLE CHOICE

Within the scope of practice of podiatry in Massachusetts, the podiatrist's authority to prescribe or administer drugs is generally limited to medications related to which area?

- ☐ A Systemic hypertension management.
- ☒ B Treatment of the foot and ankle.
- ☐ C Treatment of psychiatric disorders.
- ☐ D All medications as long as the patient consents.
- ☐ E Only over-the-counter analgesics.

ANSWER B

WHY Massachusetts podiatry statute defines the scope as the foot and ankle. Prescriptive authority is correspondingly limited to drugs related to that scope, not systemic or unrelated conditions.

QUESTION 3

SINGLE CHOICE

With respect to continuing education (CE) for license renewal, the Massachusetts Board of Registration in Podiatry requires licensees to comply with which of the following?

- ☐ A No CE credits are required because Massachusetts has no CE requirement.
- ☒ B CE credits as established by Board regulation for each renewal cycle.
- ☐ C CE credits set by the federal Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services.

ANSWER B

WHY The Board adopts continuing education requirements that must be satisfied within each renewal cycle. Massachusetts does require CE; it is not federal, not one-time, and not contingent on discipline.

QUESTION 4

SINGLE CHOICE

A podiatrist in Massachusetts fails to obtain informed consent before performing a procedure on a patient's foot. From a jurisprudence standpoint, this is most directly a breach of which obligation?

- ☐ A Federal anti-kickback statute.

ANSWER B

WHY Informed consent is a longstanding element of the standard of care and professional conduct enforced by the Board. It is unrelated to anti-kickback, DEA registration, retention, or tax law.

QUESTION 5

SINGLE CHOICE

Massachusetts law requires certain healthcare professionals, including podiatrists, to report suspected incidents of abuse or neglect. Which of the following is the correct characterization of this duty?

ANSWER B

WHY Massachusetts mandated-reporter statutes impose a duty on specified healthcare professionals to report suspected abuse/neglect and provide immunity for reports made in good faith. The duty is not discretionary and is not limited to minors or to court-ordered cases.

QUESTION 6

SINGLE CHOICE

Under Massachusetts regulations applicable to podiatrists, which of the following best describes the requirement for patient records?

- ☐ A Records may be kept solely at the podiatrist's discretion with no retention period.

ANSWER B

WHY Massachusetts medical record regulations require that records be legible, contemporaneous, and accurate, and they establish minimum retention periods. They are not discretionary, not destroyed per visit, not limited to paper, and disclosure is governed by patient privacy law.

QUESTION 7

SINGLE CHOICE

A Massachusetts podiatrist wishes to prescribe Schedule II controlled substances within the podiatric scope of practice. Which statement is most accurate?

ANSWER B

WHY To prescribe controlled substances, including Schedule II drugs, a podiatrist must hold a federal DEA registration and a Massachusetts controlled substance registration (Massachusetts Controlled Substances Act/registration requirements). Neither is optional, and Schedule II prescribing is not categorically prohibited for podiatrists.

QUESTION 8

SINGLE CHOICE

A Massachusetts podiatrist advertises as a "board-certified foot and ankle surgeon." Which of the following is required for this advertising to comply with Board expectations regarding truthfulness and specialty claims?

- ☐ A Any self-described specialty is acceptable.

ANSWER B

WHY Massachusetts professional conduct rules (and applicable Board guidance) require advertising to be truthful and non-misleading; claims of board certification must be supported by actual certification from a recognized board. Specialty advertising is not prohibited, but must be substantiated.

QUESTION 9

TRUE FALSE

In Massachusetts, a podiatrist may treat conditions of the ankle in addition to the foot, as defined by the podiatry statute.

ANSWER A

WHY True. Massachusetts podiatry statute defines the scope of practice to include the ankle as well as the foot. A podiatrist practicing outside this defined scope would be engaging in unlicensed practice.
