WHY Stopping distance increases with speed, and worn tyres generally provide less effective braking and grip. Time of day and registration number do not directly determine stopping distance.

ANSWER **A - C**

WHY You must stop and provide the required information, and you should report the collision to the police or insurer when the circumstances require it. Injured people should not be moved unless remaining where they are presents an immediate danger.
