ANSWER B

WHY The FDP Charter is a principles-based reference framework that harmonizes how participating organizations handle data responsibly. It does not certify products (C), impose a single technology stack (A), nor replace national laws (D); those are common misconceptions.

Under the FDP Charter, which role is defined as the entity that determines the purposes and means of processing personal data?

ANSWER C

WHY The Data Controller is the entity that decides why and how personal data is processed. The Data Processor acts on the controller's instructions (A is wrong), the Data Subject is the individual the data is about (B is wrong), and Data Steward is not the FDP-defined primary role for purpose-and-means decisions (D is wrong).

QUESTION 3 SINGLE CHOICE

Which FDP Charter principle requires that personal data be adequate, relevant, and limited to what is necessary in relation to the stated purpose?

ANSWER B

WHY Data Minimization is the principle that data must be adequate, relevant, and limited to what is necessary. Purpose Limitation (A) restricts use to the original purpose, Storage Limitation (C) limits retention, and Accuracy (D) requires data to be kept correct and up to date.

A controller collects email addresses for one-time account verification and then starts using them for unrelated marketing campaigns. Which FDP Charter principle is most directly breached?

ANSWER B

WHY Purpose Limitation requires that data collected for a specified purpose not be further processed in a manner incompatible with that purpose. Repurposing verification emails for marketing is a classic breach of Purpose Limitation. The other principles are not the most directly applicable here.

Which of the following is NOT a recognized lawful basis for processing personal data under the FDP Charter?

ANSWER D

WHY Profit maximization of the controller is not a lawful basis under the Charter. Consent (A), contract performance (B), and legal obligation (C) are all recognized lawful bases for processing.

A data subject asks a controller to delete all personal data about them because it is no longer necessary for the original purpose. Which right is being invoked?

ANSWER C

WHY When data is no longer necessary for its original purpose, the data subject can invoke the Right to Erasure, also called the Right to be Forgotten. Portability (A) is about receiving data in a portable format, Objection (B) is about stopping certain types of processing such as direct marketing, and Access (D) is about viewing the data.

Which of the following best demonstrates the FDP Charter's Accountability principle?

ANSWER **A** • **B**

WHY The Charter endorses pseudonymization and encryption (A) and the resilience and security of processing systems (B) as core technical and organizational measures. Publishing customer records (C) and disabling access controls (D) would directly violate security and confidentiality requirements.
