ANSWER B

WHY The remote-proctored MET requires a private room with a clear desk and a plain background (typically a wall) behind the candidate. Books, food, drinks, other people, and study materials on the desk all violate the rules. A clear desk and bare wall is the only compliant setup.

ANSWER B

WHY MET remote-proctored testing requires a computer (typically a laptop or desktop) on which the candidate installs and runs the official proctoring software. A functioning webcam and microphone are mandatory for identity verification and continuous monitoring. Tablets, devices without webcams, and shared computers are not permitted.

ANSWER A

WHY Check-in for the MET remote-proctored exam requires a valid government-issued photo ID and a webcam scan of the room so the proctor can confirm it meets the testing environment rules. Telephone verification, mailed declarations, and written justifications are not part of the check-in procedure.

ANSWER C

WHY Candidates are instructed to contact the proctor or the official technical support channel listed in their check-in materials if a technical problem occurs. Restarting the computer without notice, letting someone else use the computer, or simply waiting until another day are not correct responses.
