Which of the following sub-tasks appear in the Speaking section of the Versant English Test? (Choose two.)

ANSWER A • C

WHY The Versant English Test Speaking section includes Reading, Repetition, Sentence Builds, Conversations, Story Retelling, and Open Questions. Essay Writing and a Lecture-style Listening task are not part of the Versant English Test Speaking section, so B and D are incorrect.

QUESTION 2

MULTIPLE CHOICE

The Versant English Test reports a candidate's performance using which of the following? (Choose two.)

- ☒ **A** An Overall score on a 20–90 scale
- ☒ **B** A CEFR level band derived from sub-scores
- ☐ **C** A hand-written examiner rating on a 0–9 IELTS-style scale
- ☐ **D** A pass/fail certification without numeric scores

ANSWER A • B

WHY The Versant English Test reports an Overall score on a 20–90 scale and breaks performance into sub-scores (Sentence Mastery, Vocabulary, Fluency, Pronunciation) that align with CEFR bands (A1–C1+). It does not use a 0–9 IELTS-style human rating (C) and it does not produce a pass/fail only result (D).

QUESTION 3 SINGLE CHOICE

Which skill is directly measured by the Versant English Test's automated scoring engine?

- ☐ A Handwriting legibility
- ☒ B Speaking proficiency
- ☐ C Typing speed
- ☐ D Reading comprehension of long academic texts only

ANSWER B

WHY The Versant English Test is an automated speaking and listening proficiency test. Its scoring engine evaluates oral performance (along with listening in some tasks), not handwriting, typing speed, or exclusively long academic reading passages.

QUESTION 4 SINGLE CHOICE

How is the Versant English Test delivered to test takers?

- ☐ A As a paper-based booklet completed in a testing center with a pencil
- ☐ B As a phone interview with a live human examiner
- ☒ C Online on a computer, with spoken responses captured by a microphone headset

ANSWER C

WHY The Versant English Test is delivered online and uses speech-recognition and spoken-response technology: candidates speak into a microphone headset and the automated engine scores their responses. Paper-based, live-examiner, and cassette formats are not used.

Which task is part of the Writing section of the Versant English Test?

ANSWER A

WHY The Versant English Test Writing section includes Typing, Sentence Builds, Dictation, and Email Composition (Write an Email). Story Retelling, Open Questions, and Conversations are Speaking section tasks, not Writing tasks.

In the Versant English Test, which task type belongs to the Reading section?

ANSWER B

WHY Reading Comprehension is a Reading section item in the Versant English Test. Dictation is a Listening/Writing item, and Conversations and Story Retelling are Speaking items.

Approximately how long does the full Versant English Test take to complete?

ANSWER C

WHY The Versant English Test is designed as a roughly one-hour assessment that covers Speaking, Listening, Reading, and Writing. Five minutes is far too short for the full battery, 15 minutes is closer to a screening sub-battery, and three hours is well beyond the published test length.

QUESTION 8 SINGLE CHOICE

Which of the following is recommended before starting the Versant English Test?

- ☒ A Completing the microphone and sound check provided by the test interface
- ☐ B Disabling the headset so responses are recorded from the laptop's built-in speakers

ANSWER A

WHY Candidates are instructed to run the microphone/sound check at the start of the Versant test so the engine can capture clear audio. Disabling the headset (B) would degrade recording quality, speaking unnaturally fast (C) hurts fluency scores, and leaving the room (D) interrupts the session and can invalidate it.

QUESTION 9

SINGLE CHOICE

On what numeric scale is the Versant English Test Overall score reported?

ANSWER B

WHY The Versant English Test Overall score is reported on a 20 to 90 scale, with sub-scores in Sentence Mastery, Vocabulary, Fluency, and Pronunciation. The 0–9 scale is associated with IELTS, not Versant; the TOEFL iBT total is 0–120; and Versant does not use a 1–100 percentile scale for the Overall score.
