ANSWER A - C

WHY The Nevada Rules of Professional Conduct require competent representation and protect information relating to the representation of current and certain former clients. A lawyer is not required to accept every prospective client and cannot guarantee an outcome.

Which two statements accurately describe the role of pleadings in a Nevada civil action? (Choose two.)

ANSWER A - C

WHY Pleadings frame the issues by providing notice of claims, defenses, and, where applicable, the relief requested. Allegations are not automatically established as true, and the parties remain responsible for proving the elements of their claims or defenses.

ANSWER A

WHY Negligence generally involves a breach of a duty of reasonable care that proximately causes legally recognized harm. The described traffic collision fits that definition.

Which mental state describes a person who consciously disregards a substantial and unjustifiable risk that a prohibited result will occur?

ANSWER A

WHY Recklessness is the conscious disregard of a substantial and unjustifiable risk. Mistake of fact, duress, and entrapment are separate doctrines that may bear on criminal liability or responsibility.

Which type of evidence is offered to prove a fact in issue by demonstrating a likelihood of the fact based on ordinary human experience?

ANSWER A

WHY Circumstantial evidence indirectly proves a fact by allowing an inference to be drawn from the evidence offered. Direct evidence proves a fact without such an inference.

ANSWER A

WHY The Fifth Amendment includes the privilege against self-incrimination. The other provisions concern different constitutional protections.

ANSWER A

WHY An easement is a nonpossessory interest that generally gives its holder a right to use land possessed by another for a defined purpose. A fee simple absolute is an ownership interest, while a remainder and reversion are future interests.

QUESTION 8 SINGLE CHOICE

A lawyer learns a material fact relating to the representation of a current client. Under the duty of confidentiality, when may the lawyer reveal that information without the client's informed consent?

ANSWER A

WHY Information relating to a current client's representation generally must be kept confidential. Disclosure without informed consent is limited to situations in which it is impliedly authorized or otherwise permitted under the applicable rules.

ANSWER B

WHY Negligence requires duty, breach, causation, and damages. The element addressing the defendant's conduct is the breach of the duty of care. Negligence is unintentional, so intent is not required, and premises liability is generally analyzed through ordinary negligence principles rather than automatic or strict liability.
